TULP Food Pantry received a donation of \$500 from United Cooperative in Shawano and a matching donation of \$500 made directly to our Feeding America account by Land O'Lakes Foundation. Together, United Cooperative, with matching donations from the Land O'Lakes Foundation donated \$41,000 to 40 food pantries this past year. These donations are provided by the cooperatives in honor of its farmer/members across South Central, Southwest, and Northeast Wisconsin, United Cooperative's main service area. We are very grateful for this donation toward hunger relief efforts at the TULP Food Pantry. It is with donations such as these that we are able to purchase food through Feeding America at \$.19/pound. Occasionally we need to purchase from local grocers in order to balance out the food we get from Feeding America. We have also purchased food through a special bulk purchasing event through Feeding America,

items that we typically don't get from them. The food we get from Feeding America is all donated by manufacturers, grocers, etc. who have overstocks, re-branded items, and meat items that have been frozen. They are working on a system to

get us more fresh produce, but because of the short shelf life, that is an issue at most smaller food pantries.

St. Mary's Church in Leopolis donated food that was collected over the Christmas season, and the Leopolis Homemakers and The Kitchen maids groups each donated \$100 to the Food Pantry and the 6-point smear club in Tilleda donated \$30. Youth from St. Mary's in Leopolis put together birthday bags for us. In December we served 29 families for a total of 90 people. Winter is usually a time when more people need food. Thanks to area Food Drives and monetary donations, we have been able to offer help to these families. Thank you so much for all of your support.

New Business:




